The aim of the site: My aim is to help young researchers and academics master the craft of writing and to help them publish in academic journals.

The Audience: Our subscribers consist of PhD students, Postdoctoral researchers, Professors, and researchers in the field.

The Tone: Friendly yet rigorously researched. Think about it as giving candid writing advice over coffee to a colleague or a student. We are not a reserved publication. I like to inject our articles with humor; however, we aim for depth and rigor.

What I'm Looking For:

- Insider's views: things you have tried and worked for you, methods you follow, tips of things that have worked, advice you give to others.
- Personal stories: sharing your struggles with writing, what you find most difficult in writing, why you write.
- Process tools: concrete tools or processes you follow for specific tasks of writing a paper.

Article formats

- **Short, tactical articles** Share something you know that works, with examples. Usually around 500-1000 words.
- Deep, all-encompassing breakdowns Take our reader from start to finish on a specific process. Think: deep dive on research design, unique methodologies, etc. These can be anything from 2,000 to 4-5,000 words.

- Interviews with experts A Q&A format with an experienced academic or someone with a unique perspective or skill set.
- **Students**' tips: if you are a student share with us things you have learned that have worked for you.
- Other We are open to other suggestions, send us a pitch!

What we are looking for in a contributor:

- You have AUTHORITY. You can be an established academic or a student, but you have to have an experience or an observation that is backed by facts, anecdotes, interviews, and/or data.
- You are willing to promote your post. Our most successful posts are usually the result of the author promoting to their audience alongside our normal channels.
- You are willing to answer questions in the comments section. Posts can generate dozens of comments. The best ones become a discussion involving the author.
